### SIGHT TESTS

All children aged under 16 are eligible for a free annual sight test.

Children can have an eye test at any age, whether or not they can read or speak; the test is tailored to your child's age and needs.

80% of what a child learns is through their vision. Children are less likely to notice an eye problem than adults, so it's important to have regular check-ups. Here are some symptoms that could need further investigation:

### BARRIERS TO LEARNING
