WHY DOES IT MATTER?

As we move into the summer term, this is when children make some of their biggest learning steps, especially in reading, writing, and maths. Being in school every day helps children build confidence, keep routines & stay connected with their peers.

We're here to work in partnership with families to support good attendance and ensure every child has the best chance to thrive. Even small improvements make a big difference to learning and wellbeing.

UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE



Every time a child is absent, the school must mark it as authorised or unauthorised.

We recognise being away from school is unavoidable sometimes, for example, if a child has vomited. Unauthorised absence means the reason is not acceptable.

Examples include (but are not limited to):

- Oversleeping
- Celebrating a birthday
- A parent being ill
- A parent's work obligations
- Holidays during term time, including long weekends
